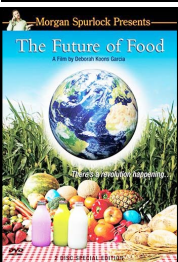

THE FUTURE OF FOOD



On February 7th at 2PM the fourth and final film of the Curtis Township Library Food Series will be shown. This film has wonderful and informative interviews with Andrew Kimbrell, director of the center for Food Safety, Fred Kirshenman, a well known sustainable farmer, and a number of experts and scientists who document first off how genetically-engineered food was pushed on the American people with no disclosure and no testing as well as the devastating potential for destruction with messing with our food supply for profit. The Future of Food documents what is currently going on with the food supply in the US. 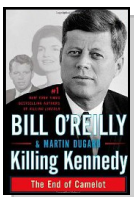

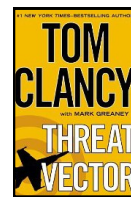
