You know that computers are everywhere. If you're new to computers, get frustrated trying to work on yours, never owned one or are afraid you'll break the darn thing if you buy one, you'll need to come to our mini-computer classes.

The CTL has just submitted a grant application for 2 computers on mobile carts to be used as class training aids. If the library receives the grant later this winter or early spring, the plan is to begin holding classes for our patrons as early as June. The class size will be one or two students max, so there will be plenty of personal attention for each of you. A class should last about an hour and the plan is to have two classes each Thursday afternoon. If we have more people signing up, we'll hold more classes. If you have your own laptop computer it may be possible for you to use it. Many requests have been made for this library service and we are trying to bring it to you as soon as possible. Stay tuned for further developments.

If you haven't heard yet, your Social Security checks will have to be sent electronically (no more paper checks in the mail!) to a bank, a credit union or a Direct Express® Debit MasterCard® by computer starting on March 1, 2013 so whether you want to or not, the electronic age is knocking on your door so you'd better get to know how to get around using a computer. They're easy to use once you get to know them.

Computers are not mysterious. If you are an adventurous sort you could most likely figure them out for yourself or with the help of your 5-year old grandchild. If all goes well, if the grant leprechauns are in a good mood and if you, our patrons, are generous too, we will be able to help you with this jump into the 21st century soon.






