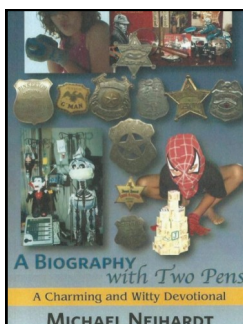

### SUPER VEGGIES SEMINAR

On April 16th, Kathy Freel of MSU Extension Service visited Curtis Township Library and a good turnout of library patrons were treated to a fascinating and extremely informative talk about the use of vegetables in our diet for better health and nutrition.

Topics including how to choose the best vegetables (fresh, frozen, canned, etc); recognizing the best vegetables by their color; what are the better methods for preparing them.

Kathy also discussed the proportion of vegetable to meats that forms the optimum balance of nutrition; how to read labels on food packages and recognize preferable ingredients as well as those that might be best avoided.

It was a highly informative seminar that ended with the surprisingly tasty treat of a unique salad made from: carrot, orange, raisin, plain yogurt and lettuce.

### SUMMER HOURS

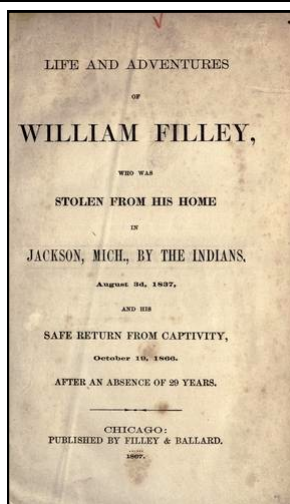
Beginning in May the library moves to summer hours. On Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday the library remains open until 6PM.
