LIBRARY NEWS ITEMS

We've had a \$250 anonymous donation to put toward the \$500 challenge match made by another anonymous donor toward the replacement of the front door of the library. Now we just need another \$250 dollars.

We are also having our last summer program on July 28th at 6PM at the Curtis Township Hall: "Old Time Rock And Roll"- a rocking musical event that takes a look back through musical history. The event is free for all.

Our Library Director, Moira Maus, has grants out for funding in almost every direction. She has a mini grant out for audio books for the sight impaired or those who simply want to listen rather than read.

Another grant for \$3,000 for another section of shelving to build up our DVD collection. (In June of 2009 the library loaned out 265 videos, in June of 2010 the library loaned out 596 videos) . The citizens of Curtis Township are beginning to realize what a resource the library is for entertainment as well as information.

Our Library Director also has a grant out for \$51,454 to the US Department of Agriculture for Reinvestment And Recovery to fund improvements to the township library infrastructure.

A grant request to the Robert C. Reinhart organization for \$25,000 has also been submitted. Keep your fingers crossed, folks.

The library board has also reviewed and passed the formal library policies for : Circulation, ILL, Patron Use of Phones, Unattended Child, Computer and Internet usage, Meeting Room Policy, Photocopying

CURTIS TOWNSHIP LIBRARY ENDOWMENT FUND

It has been several years since we have featured an article reminding our patrons and benefactors about the workings of funds for the library. Many new members have joined the library and may not be aware of the donation system for our library. The state funds that we use to help keep the library running keep getting smaller every year. A sizeable percentage of the moneys needed to keep the library operating come from our Endowment Fund.

The current Curtis Township Library was completed in 1998 with the help of over 75 volunteer workers and \$100,000 in grant money. The CTL has expanded its services each year to meet the diverse recreational, technological and informational needs of the residents of Glennie and surrounding areas of Curtis Township and beyond.

In 2005 the CTL was the recipient of the PLA EBSCO *Excellence in Small and/or Rural Public Library Service Award*, becoming one of only 11 libraries in the country to win this prestigious award. The award came with a \$1000 prize which the CTL Board of Trustees used to establish this endowment fund to improve library services.

All donations are invested under the sole control of the

Community Foundation of Northeast Michigan. Audits are performed annually and are available for public review. Donations are deductible on both federal and state income tax returns.

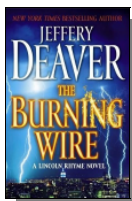
Donations may be made by check or by credit card/online or by bequest made in wills or trusts. Donation details, forms and tax deduction information for contributing to the CTL Library Endowment Fund are available at the library or online at www.cfnem.org. You can find a wealth of information on the fund there.

The moneys or parts of your estate that you donate or will to the library are FOREVER! They are considered the principal and the library is able to only apply for and draw on the interest for projects needed at the library by applying to the Fund for specific projects.

Granted the last few years have taken a toll on our fund but there seems to be a light at the end of the tunnel.

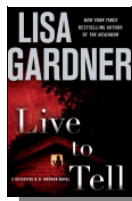
