BAD NEWS FROM THE STATE (SO WHAT ELSE IS NEW!)

The Governor and state government have issued numerous cuts to the budget. State Aid for public libraries has been reduced 36% and another 14% has been recommended by the State Senate. Local public libraries have been cut 4% for this year alone (\$400,000). State Aid drops from \$0.3247 to \$0.3118. Our Superiorland Co-op's loss is \$16,000. Library of Michigan reduction is \$344,500. Federal LSTA (Library Services and Technology Act) funds pay for 100 percent of the MeL (Michigan Electronic Library) and MelCat (Catalog) which every library in Michigan uses. As State Aid decreases, federal aid decreases because LSTA requires local support (State Aid). To put all of this in perspective: Michigan residents performed over 40 million in the subscription databases, an increase of over 60% over 2007. 28.3 million articles were downloaded (an increase of over 8%) 213,439 electronic books were used. If Michigan's public libraries had purchased these subscriptions individually, the cost would have been about \$72,223,000. If Michigan residents had paid for each article they

downloaded the cost to them would have been about \$424,500,000. Since MeLCAT databases can be accessed from home or the library, the figures are probably much higher. MeLCAT serves 351 libraries and contains 9.12 million records with over 37 million holdings. In 2008, Michigan residents borrowed 680,593 items, a 75% increase over 2007.

Michigan residents are using their local libraries more than ever before to apply for unemployment benefits, look for jobs, taxes and write resumes online. Unemployed residents often discontinue their Internet access at home to save money and rely on their libraries. Many libraries supply basic computer training for their users. LSTA funds provide a learning platform called the Learning Express Library which provides practice tests for high school students' ACT and SAT tests. Residents can take practice tests for GED, citizenship, civil service, commercial driver license, firefighters, law enforcement and nursing. Children are among the heaviest users of library services. Summer reading programs help children increase their reading scores. LSTA funds are used to buy summer reading manuals. Children that do not participate in reading programs drop one grade level in reading ability over the summer.

Contact your state government officials (you can find their names in the *GC News Classifieds* as well as *www.curtistownship.com* and let them know, in no uncertain terms that now is not the time cut library services state funds.
