LIBRARY NEWS

Even with the drastic cutbacks in state funding for our library, our amazing Library Director, Moira Maus and her dedicated staff and volunteers have managed to keep our library going and growing. If you visit the library you will notice that the new section of shelves has been built and stocked. We have a lot more room to grow now. More sections are needed to complete the renovation. If you can donate to that cause please do. Every year the price of shelving goes up.

We have acquired the services of George Schultz through a government work program: Experience Works, at no cost to our library. He works 21 hours a week and has already: donated and installed a digital thermostat to help the library reduce heating costs, cleaned the overhead fluorescent lighting grids and ceiling fans and removed some lighting tubes to reduce eyestrain for the staff, organized the

mechanical room, changed the furnace filter, learned how to package books to be returned to other libraries after loans are completed, learned how to re-shelve books and straighten the book stacks, fixed a plumbing leak in the ladies' bathroom, manages the burn barrel and does the snow shoveling and is re-arranging the workroom to create a packing area for out-state library book loan returns. A couple of our favorite volunteers: Ken Walls and Zane Newberry, assembled our new section of shelves on January 22.

Please remember that if you have old printer cartridges of any kind, donate them to the library because we can redeem them for badly-needed office supplies.
