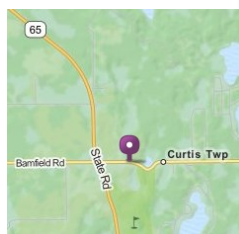
There will be a movie suggestion sheet so you can let us know what would you like to see in the future.

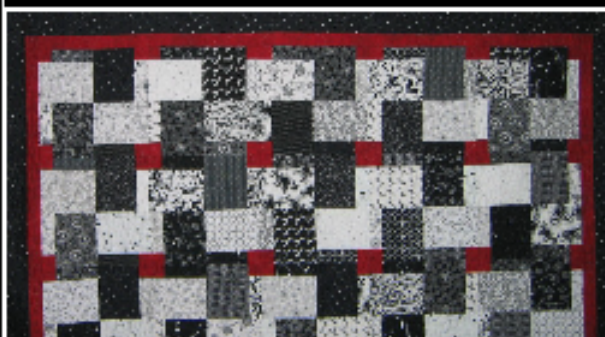

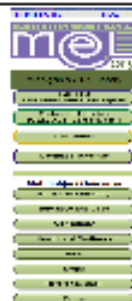
"Curtis Area Emergency Relief Fund Quilt Raffle"
