## Meeting Our Challenges

Thanks to hard-working members and community support of our book sales, the Friends earned \$4,537 in 2016. Generous donors gave an additional \$465 to bring our year's total to \$5,002, within just a few dollars of our 2015 results of \$5,089. We were able to once again fund Library programming, as well as commit funds for replacement of some Library flooring, and for wider distribution of opinion surveys throughout the community to support the Library's strategic planning initiative.



But we want to do more, so we also appropriated funds to purchase a spiffy portable gas grill so we can once again do brat sales, which were significant fundraisers

in the past. Books and eats are what our community appreciates, and what we'll be supplying in 2017.

## Thanks Again!




