- Call us to schedule a 30-minute appointment to come inside & select books, use the computer, or have us run off copies, send faxes, etc. Our number is 932-0203.
- A limited number of people can be inside the library at the same time. If possible, limit you party to two or less.
- Hand sanitizer is available for visitors. Please use upon entering the building, and before and after computer use.
- Face coverings and social distancing requirements are mandatory. We have complimentary masks for anyone who forgets to bring one along.
- Library staff will also be wearing masks when they assist you & Plexiglas sneeze guards have been installed at the front desk.
- We will disinfect keyboards, counters, and hard surfaces regularly throughout the day.

CHILD RESOURCE ROOM remains closed at this time. Toys, games, and puppets are not available for check out or for play at this time.

CHILDREN AND TEEN AREAS are open. We are limiting visits to one family/group at a time in our basement area. We will be limiting some book selections to allow us to sanitize appropriately.

COMPUTER USE 2 public computers are available; computer use is limited to 30 minutes per day.

FAXING/COPYING/SCANNING Staff will do this for you.

WI-FI Available 24/7 and we encourage you to use it! Feel free to sit in our backyard and use it any time.

CURBSIDE SERVICE is still available every day but Saturday. Request items (see below) and call us at 932-0203 to set up a time to pick up your items at our Norfolk Street entrance.
