Focus: Friends of Menominee County Library

Friends of Menominee County Library have a single purpose: to help the library in carrying out its activities and projects. Sometimes this takes the form of monetary assistance. Over the last several years, we have financed technology equipment, supplies and programs for summer reading programs, and refreshments for various events at which residents of Menominee County expand their knowledge base.

The Friends' major fund-raising has taken three main forms: a Memorial Day weekend plant sale, a summer used book sale, and a fall raffle. Each of these has been successful, although this year's plant sale was cancelled for reasons we explored in the spring 2018 newsletter.

We have been considering new forms of fund raising in case we decide next spring not to return the plant sale to our calendar of activities. We can always use setup workers on July 26th and book and raffle ticket sellers on the 27th and 28th.

Director's Report

Library director Amanda Winnicki reported at the Friends' meetings on May 24th. Key points from her report:

- We've been awarded a Marinette & Menominee Community Foundation Grant for a Story Trail. We will receive the award in June, and any suggestions for titles to use are appreciated.
- The new bookmobile will arrive in June, but we do not have an exact date yet.
- The Summer Reading schedule is set. Kick-off is June 12-14, and the first program is June 21 at 1:30. The rest will be on Wednesdays through July, skipping the 4th. Everyone is welcome at the programs.
- We will be running an adult Book Bingo challenge from Memorial Day to Labor Day. Forms are available at the library, the bookmobile, and the Hermansville branch.
- The library has received a donation of specialty cake pans will be working on promoting those. There are lots of fun ones available to check out.
- We are partnering with the Intermediate School District to combine their biweekly play group with our Toddler Storytime. We will be running Storytime through the summer and the toddler crafts will be "bagged" and available for adult caregivers to "Take and Make."
- We have added a puzzle table in the adult side and will be working on re-arranging the shelves this summer to make a better space for periodical reading.

We are holding our elections a month later than usual this year: June 28 at 2:30 p.m. We have a slate of candidates for the ballot, but we also welcome nominations from the membership. These positions are excellent pathways to the heart of the Friends' organization.

Garden Project

Although the library staff members are accustomed to positive comments on the library garden, we are fighting a serious battle with quack grass, which persists in attacking the garden with a willful determination. The gardening crew seems to grow a bit less hearty each year as age and arthritis enter the game. In response, we have initiated a garden study with two main goals: (1) revise the garden plan to make the garden easier to maintain and (2) retain the visual appeal that library patrons have appreciated in the years since our last restyling of the garden.



Gina Thompson, the library's new bookmobile assistant, has agreed to help us with the garden project. Gina has an associate's degree in horticulture, and she has performed landscape maintenance, installations, and renovations for several years. She also managed a native plant nursery in Door County. In other words, she's had considerable experience in gardening, and we look forward to hearing her ideas. The first meeting to explore possibilities will take place on June 7th at 10:00 a.m. in the Hayward Room at the library. Interested members and library patrons are welcome. The Friends members who plan to attend the meeting are Glenda Keiran, Karen Kovach, and Ruth Kranberg. Gina Thompson will attend as well.

Annual Raffle

We are trying a craft table at the book sale on Friday and Saturday July 27-28. Immerfrost Farm has offered lovely metal bookmarks at their cost for us to sell, and President Joan has shown her usual incredible artistic talent in re-purposing a wooden rocker as a planter and repainting a side table. We welcome additional items—whether it be knitting or crocheting, woodworking, sewing/quilting, painting—whatever creations you might have to offer. We will appreciate your help in pricing your items. We do not want to over- or under-charge.

We also will take a few “white elephants,” items that are clean, in good working order, and likely to attract interest. No overly large items, please, as we simply do not have the room for them.

We will be calling for workers in a few weeks. We need people to move the books from the library to the township hall and sort them by author and type from **8:00 to 11:45 on Thursday, July 26th and possibly 1:00 to 3:00**. We also need to cover the township hall **8:00 to 5:00 on Friday July 27th and 9:00 to 1:00 on July 28th**. We will be in the township hall only again this year, but we will be selling raffle tickets and craft table items.


