Dear Patrons,

We've had an excellent response to the GLTB survey that was included in the last newsletter. I'd like to thank each of you who took the time to fill it out and return it to us. From the results, we've gotten to know you, our Patrons, better and what we can do to improve our services. Some requested magazines or a change in their profile, but didn't include their name. Please contact me. Here some of the things we learned:

While over half of our patrons have contacted our office at least once during the past year, almost half have never contacted us. Most of you are "very satisfied" with the number of books you receive, but there were many who are "somewhat satisfied" with the subject matter of the books. I can make changes in your profile so that the books you receive are better matched to your interests. Call or email me so that I can do this. Also, if we set your book profile to "Request Only", you'll receive only the books you've selected, not the ones that the computer has selected from your Profile Subject list. However, you will need to send me a list of the books you'd like. You will need to take some time to go through the *Talking Books Topics* catalog and make your selections. There is an order form at the back of the catalog for checking the titles you choose. Mail this to me or call and give me the book numbers, and I'll enter them into your *Request* list. You can also make requests for a book by calling or emailing me the name of the author or title, and I'll see if it's available.

If you do not request books, the computer will choose them for you based on the subjects or authors that you have requested. These can be changed or added to at any time, just give me a call.

All of the responses indicated that you, our Patrons, would recommend our services to a friend or family member. This is good to hear!

**\*DB76196 *The Unlikely Pilgrimage of Harold Fry: A Novel* by Rachel Joyce**  
(September's Book Club selection) **Meet Harold Fry,**  
recently retired. He lives in a small English village with his wife, Maureen, who  
seems irritated by almost everything he does, even down to how he butters his  
toast. Little differentiates one day from the next. Then one morning the mail  
arrives, and within the stack is a letter addressed to Harold from a woman he  
hasn't seen or heard from in 20 years. His journey begins!

**DB72129 *Unbroken: A World War II Story of Survival, Resilience, and***  
***Redemption* by Laura Hillenbrand** **Written by the**  
author of *Seabiscuit*, this is another true-life account about beating unbelievable  
odds. In May of 1943, an Army Air Forces bomber crashed into the Pacific Ocean  
and disappeared, leaving only a spray of debris and a slick of oil, gasoline, and  
blood. Then, on the ocean surface, a face appeared.....

***New York Times* as "a marvel of storytelling", *The Things They Carried's* portrayal**  
of the boots-on-the-ground experience of soldiers in the Vietnam War is a

**DB75192 *The Light Between Oceans: A Novel* by M. L. Stedman** **A**  
captivating, beautiful, and stunningly accomplished debut novel – the story of a  
lighthouse keeper and his wife who make one devastating choice that forever  
changes two worlds. In 1918, after four harrowing years on the Western Front,

four times a year and shore leaves are granted every other year at best, Tom  
brings a young, bold, and loving wife, Isabel. Three years later, after two  
miscarriages and one stillbirth, the grieving Isabel is tending the grave of her  
newly lost infant when she hears a baby's cries on the wind.
